Randal continues to frequent the shelter, but as the days pass, Juno is no longer her happy self. She is clearly distressed - something very traumatic is happening in her life. Outside the shelter, the young girl continues to visit Randal, yet clearly, she is sick with something serious. She has a shaved head and is often pale.


